





Dear Padre,

What is original sin?

Original sin is the sin that occurred at the origins of the human race. "Although he was made by God in a state of holiness, from the very onset of his history man abused his liberty, at the urging of the Evil One. Man set himself against God and sought to attain his goal apart from God" (Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, [Gaudium et Spes], 13).

According to Genesis, a world of beauty was deformed by sin. The first two chapters tell how God created all things, including people, and saw that they were "very good." However, in chapter three, Adam rejects God and separates himself from God. Adam tries to hide from God, blames Eve for his sin, and experiences the pangs of guilt.

From this original sin, a host of evils followed, resulting in division, pain, bloodshed, loneliness, and death. The reality that this tragic, familiar narrative points to is a basic part of our experience. It is the teaching of the Church that every mortal born into this world, except the Virgin Mary, is affected by original sin. This means that each "descendant of Adam" (including us) is created without sanctifying grace and is subject to the inclination to sin and to death. Each of us needs redemption through the saving death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Feasts and Saints of the Week

St. Barnabas - Feast Day is June 11th. He was a 1st c. Cypriot Jew, who became a member of the Christian community in Jerusalem. Even though he wasn't one of the original 12 apostles, he was still referred to as an "apostle" by the early Christian church. Named Joseph at birth, he was nicknamed "Barnabas," which means "Son of Encouragement." He was noted primarily for his generosity, having sold his property and given the proceeds to the community. His other notable attributes were being trusting, kind, supportive, and encouraging. He accompanied St. Paul on several missionary journeys and defended Gentile

converts against the Judaizers. Spreading the gospel throughout the region of Cyprus and at Antioch in Greece, he became the patron saint of both places. Martyred for his faith in Cyprus, he was one of the most prominent disciples of Christ in the early church.



St. Anthony of Padua - Feast Day is June 13th. He was a 13th c. Portuguese Franciscan priest (OFM) born in Lisbon. Universally invoked and venerated as the patron saint for the recovery of lost items, he has been credited with many miracles concerning lost people, lost things, and lost spiritual goods. Nicknamed the "Hammer of Heretics" for his bold preaching and converting many heretics to the Christian faith, he moved many others also to follow Jesus as he proclaimed God's mercy and goodness in his sermons and is recognized as a Doctor of the Church. He's often pictured holding the Christ Child in his arms, signifying that we should become Christlike in the way we treat the world. He died in Padua, Italy

and is buried in the Basilica of St. Anthony. It's interesting to note that even though his body decomposed, his tongue was incorrupt (a sign of his great preaching skills) and is preserved in a special reliquary at the church.
