Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe November 24, 2024

FOCUS: Jesus is King and Lord of all both now and forever.

The readings from Daniel and the Book of Revelation share an apocalyptic vision of the Son of Man coming on the clouds to rule over all peoples. In John's Gospel, on the other hand, Jesus is already king. His everlasting authority comes from God. For his disciples – those who listen to his voice – eternal life is already possible.



HIS LIFE AS TRUTH FR. JOSEPH JUKNIALIS

We are bombarded by many statements professing to be true. Advertisers seek our endorsement, political parties seek our allegiance, and friends seek our agreement. Each purports to offer truth. In the Gospel this week, Pilate asks Jesus whether he is a king. Jesus replies, "You say I am a king. For this...I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice" (John 18:37).

What is Jesus' truth? We tend to go through life taking stands on various issues: how to raise children, what kind of exercise is best, which political approach to endorse, and countless others. Once we decide, we often make that stance one of life's truths and proclaim all others false. Jesus, on the other hand, offers his life as truth, much bigger than our petty truths. His truth stretches us beyond what we already are, more than life issues that change daily. His life's truth declares that meaning is found only by living for others, that loving someone can heal their pain, that wisdom is found in the struggle, that less is more. Jesus' ultimate truth is doing his Father's will. The fact that it is difficult or that we tend not to live it very well makes it no less the truth.

Dear Padre, November 24, 2024

When receiving the Body and Blood of Christ, I feel the need to respond, "Thank you, Jesus. Amen." Is this OK or should I just stick to "Amen"?

"Amen" is an appropriate response, in and of itself. An emphatic, heartfelt "Amen" is an affirmation of faith meant to capture our feelings of profound gratitude and awe in the presence of God. It's also a statement of belief, roughly translated as "truly," "most assuredly," or "so be it" to what has been said. For example, when we conclude the Creed with "Amen," it repeats and confirms the first words "I believe." "To believe is to say 'Amen' to God's words, promises and commandments; to entrust oneself completely to him who is the 'Amen' of infinite love and perfect faithfulness" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1064). "Jesus Christ is...the definitive 'Amen' of the Father's love for us. He takes up and completes our 'Amen' to the Father.... That is why we utter the Amen through him, to the glory of God" (CCC 1065). Sharing in the one bread and the one cup is a time of unity with God and with God's people. Each individual communicant's "Amen" is also meant to be an expression of our unity together in receiving the Body and Blood of Christ. Responding with something other than "Amen" may serve to disrupt that unity and draw attention to yourself. So, yes, stick with a sincere, mindful "Amen!"

FEASTS & SAINTS OF THE WEEK



St. Andrew Dung-Lac and Companions- Feast Day is November 24th. A Vietnamese priest who was a convert to the Catholic faith, St. Andrew Dung-Lac was one of 117 people brutally martyred in Vietnam between 1820 and 1862 for refusing to renounce their faith. St. Pope John Paul II canonized this group in 1988 (96 Vietnamese, 11 Spaniards, and 10 French of whom 8 were bishops, 50 were priests, and 59 were lay people). Through the merits of these patron saints of Vietnam, we're given the message: "that no

matter how difficult life is and how much we have to endure, it's all worth it in the end." One of the martyrs, Fr. Jean-Theophane Venard, greatly inspired St. Therese of Lisieux with his letters, which convey how nothing on earth gave him happiness, but only thoughts fixed on eternity.



St. Catherine of Alexandria- Feast Day is November 25th. This Christian saint and virgin, who was martyred in the early 4th c., was born and also died in Alexandria, Egypt. A convert to Christianity after having received a vision, she's noted for: her honesty and integrity in following Jesus Christ, wisdom and debating skills even against 50 pagan philosophers, and help to protect against sudden death. She was one of the 14 Holy Helpers and devotion to her spread as a result of the Crusades. She was martyred at age 18 by beheading after a spiked wheel, which she was bound to, didn't kill her. Angels have been said to have carried her body to a monastery at

the foot of Mt. Sinai. Her famous quote was: "Be who God meant you to be, and you will set the world on fire." She's the patroness of students, teachers, librarians, lawyers, and philosophers.



St. Andrew the Apostle - Feast Day is November 30th. Considered Christ's 1st disciple and 1 of the 12 Apostles named by Jesus along with his brother Simon Peter, St. Andrew was a fisherman who was chosen to be a "fisher of men." Even though he isn't mentioned much in the Gospels, he teaches us how to love Jesus better and follow him no matter what the cost. After Jesus was crucified, he did missionary activity by preaching the gospel in regions around the Black Sea, particularly in Greece and Turkey. He was eventually martyred in Greece

at age 80 by being nailed to an X-shaped cross, in which he died after 3 days of agony (he felt unworthy to die on an upright cross as Jesus did). He's the patron saint of Scotland, several other countries, fishmongers, singers, gout, sore throats, spinsters, and women wishing to become mothers.
