

Dear Padre,

July 7, 2024

My Protestant friends asked me why we call priests "Father" when Jesus said not to. I don't know how to answer.

Jesus instructs his disciples, "As for you, do not be called 'Rabbi.' You have but one teacher, and you are all brothers. Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven" (Matthew 23:8-9). Taken in context, Jesus is denouncing the scribes and Pharisees for bestowing honors and titles on themselves. If taken literally, this passage would also prohibit us from calling our biological fathers by that name, or our instructors "professor."

Jesus assures us that God is Father of us all. The early Christian community adopted family terms—father, mother, brother, sister—to show their affiliation through baptism and their mutual faith in the Lord (See Luke 8:21, "My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and act on it.")

Thus, St. Paul refers to Timothy as his "child in faith" (1 Timothy 1:2; Philippians 2:22). He also tells his Christian converts, "I am writing...to admonish you as my beloved children. Even if you should have countless guides to Christ, yet you do not have many fathers, for I became your father in Christ Jesus through the gospel" (1 Corinthians 4:14-15). Like St. Paul, who speaks of himself as a father in nurturing the faith, priests are called "Father" for their pastoral role in the Church. • Fr. Buron Miller, CSsR/DearPadre.ora

Feasts and Saints of the Week



St. Augustine Zhao Rong and Companions - Feast Day is July 9th. This Chinese soldier of the 18th c. became the first Chinese-born diocesan priest and martyr. After learning about the Catholic faith, he was baptized and took the name of Augustine, as it was St. Augustine's feast day. During the persecution of Christianity, many Christians were arrested. He taught and preached the gospel and was eventually subject to terrible abuse and died in prison. He remained steadfast in his vocation and in his faith. Pope John Paul II canonized him in 2000 along with 120 others: 87 Chinese Catholics and 33 Western Missionaries, who were martyred from the mid-17th - 20th c.



St. Benedict - Feast Day is July 11th. An Italian Christian monk, writer, and theologian of the 6th c., Benedict of Nursia became known as St. Benedict. Having founded the Benedictine order, he was noted as the Father of Western Monasticism. His main achievement was his rule, that provided for the governing and also the spiritual and material well-being of monasteries. Its daily routine of prayer, manual labor, and study shaped Christianity for nearly 1500 years with prayer being the foundation of monastic life. He had special gifts of prophesying. working miracles, and reading people's minds. He is the patron saint of students and co-patron of Europe.



St. Henry – Feast Day is July 13th. An emperor of Bavaria in the 10th c., he was the only German monarch to be honored as a saint. Due to his holy life, he reigned magnificently and sought the greater glory of God in all things. Though he was not happy about becoming emperor, he brought a sense of devotion to God and care for his people during his reign. His core values were piety and charity and reflected these in having monasteries built, helping the poor, and relieving oppression. Being loyal to the Pope was important to him also. He is the patron saint of the childless, dukes, handicapped, and those rejected by a religious order.
