

Do those who have died really remember us?

There are many clear indications in the Bible that the saints in heaven are aware of us and that there is interaction between those in heaven and people on earth. The most obvious passage is found in Hebrews 12:1: "Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses (those in heaven), let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us and persevere in running the race that lies before us." By their prayers, those in the "cloud of witnesses" help us finish the race.

Saint Paul wrote, "I consider that the sufferings of this present time are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for us" (Romans 8:18). We will "forget" the troubles we endured on earth, but we will be aware of the sufferings of those who are still on earth, and we will want to help them. Why? Because the greatest happiness, as Jesus said, is in giving (Acts 20:35).

The saints in heaven pray for us on earth; union with them brings us closer to Christ. We pray for those who are being purified after death, and they pray for us. We are one family. The closer our union with God, the closer our union with one another. We have a wonderful goal in life: the promise of union with God and with all those joined to God.


Feasts and Saints of the Week

<u>Nativity of St. John the Baptist</u> - Feast Day is June 24th. This high-ranking liturgical feast (Solemnity) is observed annually on this same date and honors St. John the Baptist as the "forerunner of Jesus." His role was to prepare the way for the Lord with his gifts of preaching, prophesying, and baptizing repentant followers. The prophet, Malachi, prophesied about his birth in the Old Testament by referring to him as "the messenger who would clear the way for another Messenger," one who was longed for in the hearts of God's people. Foretold by the Angel Gabriel to Zechariah that he and Elizabeth would have a son filled with the Holy Spirit, they gave praise to God for the miracle of his birth. The only biblical account of this is recorded in the Gospel of Luke.



<u>Feast of Saints Peter and Paul</u> - Feast Day is June 29th. This Solemnity is a liturgical feast that honors the martyrdom in Rome between AD 64 and 68 of two of our most beloved saints, Peter and Paul. This day is a holy day of obligation in the Latin Church. Recognized at the patron saints of Rome, these dedicated apostles of Jesus died at the hands of the Emperor Nero, who had Peter crucified upside down and Paul beheaded. It's very unlikely that they were executed on the same day of the same year though, but this feast day gives tribute to these two very important leaders, who helped establish Christ's Church with their preaching, ministry, and martyrdom. Even though they had different backgrounds, personalities, and gifts,

they dedicated themselves to serving God's people in their unique missions to fulfill His plans for their lives and give Him glory.
