

# Dear Padre,

# **August 11, 2024**

#### I miss the use of incense. Is it forbidden or out of style?

Incense is not out of style, nor is it forbidden. It is still burned to signify that Christ's sacrifice ascends to God as an odor of sweetness and as a sign of people's prayers rising to the throne of God. In the Book of Revelation, we read: "Another angel came and stood at the altar, holding a gold censer. He was given a great quantity of incense to offer, along with the prayers of all the holy ones, on the gold altar that was before the throne. The smoke of the incense along with the prayers of the holy ones went up before God from the hand of the angel" (Revelation 8:3–4).

Incense is a resinous substance obtained by cutting into the bark of a fir or pine tree. The original meaning of the Hebrew word for incense was "fragrant smoke." Ancient Jews burned incense as an act of worship in the tabernacle and temple. Scripture mentions incense often (Ephesians 5:2 and Philippians 4:18, for instance). Today, incense is often used at the benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, at funerals, and during other special liturgical celebrations to highlight the festivity of a particular occasion. Celebrants may also use incense in any liturgy to bless the congregation, the altar, the book of the Gospels, and the gifts of bread and wine.

## Feasts and Saints of the Week



**St. Clare of Assisi** - Feast Day is August 11th. She was a 13th c. Italian saint and one of the first followers of St. Francis of Assisi. So inspired by his teachings, she founded the Order of Poor Ladies known today as the Poor Clares, which is a monastic religious order for women in the Franciscan tradition. Known for her humility, poverty, and love of God, she also performed many miracles like St. Francis did in life and after death. The most notable miracle occurred when she prayed while holding a monstrance with a consecrated Host at the convent gates to ward off invaders and her attackers left. Her motto was "Steadfast in faith, forward in hope." She's the patron saint of television, computer screens, and eye diseases.



**St. Jane Frances de Chantal** - Feast Day is August 12th. She was a 16th-17th Catholic noble wife, mother, and widow. At her castle, she restored the custom of daily Mass and was engaged in various charitable works. Under the spiritual direction of St. Francis de Sales, she founded a religious community, the Visitation Order, that exemplified the virtues of humility and meekness that Mary showed at the Visitation. Originally an order centered on spiritual and corporal works of mercy, it was necessary to convert it to a cloistered community following the Rule of St. Augustine due to opposition of women in active ministry. Later on, she suffered great trials of spiritual dryness, darkness, and interior anguish. She's the patron saint of wives, mothers, and widows.



**St. Maximillian Kolbe** - Feast Day is August 14th. A 20th c. Polish Catholic priest and Conventual Franciscan friar, he worked for the conversion of sinners and enemies of the Catholic Church. He was also a noted publisher, evangelist, and martyr of charity. His story is one of heroism, courage, and self-sacrifice, shown ultimately in his volunteering to die in place of another man in the German death camp of Auschwitz during WWII. His life and death have inspired us to follow Jesus as he did and live the faith in commitment to those in need. Known as the "Knight of the Immaculata," his life was one of total union with the Immaculate Virgin. He was considered "another Christ in life and in death." He's the patron saint of amateur radio operators, drug addicts, and political prisoners.
