The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ June 2, 2024

Readings for next week:

Genesis 3: 9-15

2 Corinthians 4: 13-5:1

Mark 3: 20-35

FOCUS: Jesus' sacrifice seals our covenant with God forever.

As we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we give thanks in a particular way for Christ's perfect offering of himself as the eternal sacrifice. In ancient times, sacrifices of animals, material goods, or even humans were offered to divine entities. These were ritual ceremonies forced upon the people as an act of worship or placation. Jesus, in revealing to all the one, true God, offers his own body and blood for our salvation. This perfect sacrifice has united us to the Father once more and is the source and summit of our life in Christ.

Dear Padre,

Do we need both bread and wine to receive Christ's Body and Blood? If I receive only the host—not the Precious Blood—am I participating fully in the Eucharist?

By only taking the host you are participating fully. And if you only drink from the chalice, you also are participating fully. Christ is always fully present in each form. Many times, it is not possible to offer the chalice to a large congregation. There are also times when one cannot receive the host, especially a person who is very ill, and consuming the Precious Blood is easier.

In the Church's teaching on the Eucharist, we are invited to receive both. The *Eucharisticum Mysterium* (32) says it is especially fitting to receive Christ in both forms during the celebration of the Eucharist. This allows the Eucharist to appear more perfectly as a banquet, a feast that is a foretaste of the banquet that will be celebrated with Christ at the end of time when the kingdom of God is established in its fullness. In John 6, Jesus invites us to both eat and drink, so it is good to do both if you are able. If you aren't able, or if the chalice isn't offered at your church, you still participate fully by taking the host. Both forms are always present, because the priest must always receive both.

Feasts and Saints of the Week

St. Boniface - Feast Day is June 5th. He was an 8th c. English Benedictine monk, bishop, and martyr, who became a missionary to Germany by spreading the faith to Germanic tribes and converting many to Christianity. For that, he is known as the "Apostle to Germany." He even gave up being elected abbot, so he could devote his life to converting the Germanic pagans. Legend has it, that after hacking down a sacred oak tree of the Germanic pagans and preaching to them, many of them were baptized and he is considered as the

creator of the first Christmas tree. He's the patron saint of brewers and tailors as well as an inspiration to all.

<u>Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus</u> - Feast Day in 2024 is June 7th. This important feast of the Roman Catholic liturgical calendar since 1856 is always celebrated 19 days after Pentecost Sunday and always falls on a Friday. The devotion to the Sacred Heart shows the physical heart of Jesus, which manifests God's eternal love for all humanity. It's a symbol of both divine and human love that Jesus has for his Father and for us. His heart is depicted as inflamed with divine light, pierced by a lance-wound, encircled with a crown of thorns, and with a cross on top. Compassion, mercy, and grace flow from his heart to us and symbolize the message of the two greatest commandments for us to follow.





<u>Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary</u> - Feast Day in 2024 is June 8th. This significant feast always follows the day after the Sacred Heart of Jesus feast. Devotion to Mary's Immaculate Heart was started by St. John Eudes in 1648 to honor her holy heart and foster the realization of Mary's love for her son and all mankind. It symbolizes her interior life, joys and sorrows, virtues and perfections, love for God the Father and her son Jesus, and compassionate and motherly love for all of us. Her burning heart is usually depicted with seven swords in homage to her seven sorrows with roses surrounding it. Her heart is a model for us as how to love the Lord.
