

FOCUS: My Lord and my God!

When we receive the Eucharist, the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus are substantially present, yet disguised under the appearance of bread and wine. As with Thomas, the Lord gives us the ability to see and believe in him. A good prayer for the moments of consecration, then, is the confession of faith that Thomas makes: *My Lord and my God!*

Today, besides the Second Sunday of Easter, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. This Feast was recorded in the diary of St. Faustina and on this day, all who receive communion and go to confession, may obtain total forgiveness of all sins, which means the person would go directly to heaven without suffering in purgatory. 



The time of our liturgical year is filled with beautiful and traditional prayer opportunities. The Church dedicates the month of April to the Holy Spirit and Pope Francis' prayer intention is for health care workers. May is dedicated to our Holy Mother, and the pope's prayer intention is for faith-filled young people. Below are six suggestions to mark the 50 days of Eastertide:

- 1. Set aside each day to call on the Holy Spirit.
- 2. Do a daily Examen over the 50 days.
- 3. Read the book of Psalms in 50 days.
- 4. Pray for the intercession of St. Faustina Kowalska.
- 5. Offer a rosary or Mass for your mother or young adults in May.
- 6. Pray for the intercession of St. Damien de Veuster.
