

Are Catholic statues the same as "graven images"?

God forbade the making of idols, images of false gods (Exodus 20:4–5). But God did not forbid the making of all images. Images of cherubim were placed on the Ark of the Covenant (Exodus 37:7–9), and the Book of Numbers tells how God commanded Moses to make a bronze serpent and put it on a pole as a sign of healing (Numbers 21:7–9).

Not only is the making of images or representations of people not forbidden by God, it is so common that we take it for granted. People keep photographs of those they love. In the same way, we Catholics love the saints as family members who have gone before us, and we keep images of them in our homes and churches.

Catholics do not worship the saints; we worship and adore God alone. But we do honor the saints, remembering their holy lives as we try to imitate them. There is nothing unusual about keeping statues and paintings in prominent places. Many cities display statues of leaders and important citizens. If we are given only secular models to imitate, we will be denied models who can guide us to Jesus and to eternal life. Images of the saints are reminders of God's grace and goodness fleshed out in the lives of people very much like us.

Feasts and Saints of the Week



Dedication of the Basilica of St. Mary Major - Feast Day is August 5th. This day marks the dedication of the oldest Marian shrine for pilgrims not only in Rome, but in the whole Western world. It is also the largest church in the world, which honors God through Mary, and is one of the 4 Roman basilicas known as the patriarchal churches. Another name for this feast is "Our Lady of the Snows." It

was believed that when a Roman couple pledged their fortune to Mary as the "Mother of God," she affirmed this by sending a miraculous summer snowfall and asked that a church be built on the site. Every August 5th, this feast is celebrated with the release of a shower of white rose petals from the dome.



St. Dominic - Feast Day is August 8th. A 13th c. Castilian Catholic priest, he founded the Order of Preachers, otherwise known as the Dominican Order. Originally a contemplative, he became active in apostolic work after traveling with his bishop. He started preaching according to the gospel ideal and with fellow preachers became a community. They are credited with spreading and popularizing the rosary. Besides preaching, St. Dominic lived simply and set an example of poverty, humility, and virtue. His order's ideal was linking a life with God, study, and prayer in all forms with a ministry of salvation to people by the word of

God. His 4 Pillars are prayer, study, community, and service. He's the patron saint of astronomers and natural scientists.



St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross - Feast Day is August 9th. Named Edith Stein at birth, she was a 20th c. German Jew, who stopped believing in God at the age of 14. She was so captivated after reading St. Teresa of Avila's autobiography, that she began a spiritual journey which resulted in her conversion to Catholicism. She became a university Philosophy teacher. 12 years after her baptism, she imitated St. Teresa by joining the Carmelite Order as a Discalced Carmelite nun. She took the name of Teresa Benedicta of the Cross and her motto became "Learn to live at God's hands." She died a martyr in an Auschwitz gas chamber in 1942 after

her arrest with Dutch Jews, who became Christians. She's the patron saint of converts to Christianity and of Europe.
