



## Dear Padre

## May 12, 2024

What were the main changes brought about by the Second Vatican Council?

It has been sixty years since the Second Vatican Council and we are still learning from what Pope John Paul II called the "fundamental event in the contemporary Church" and "the constant reference point of every pastoral action." Vatican II's sixteen documents focus on a wide variety of topics, touching almost every conceivable aspect of Church and Christian life. Four of the documents bear the title of "Constitution" and contain the core formulations of the council's teachings.

The most visible change might be in how we worship. But even more fundamental is the emphasis on the Church as the "people of God." Baptism admits all to the same journey of faith, initiating each person with differing talents and abilities into the mission of the Church. Thus, the faithful must be "led to that fully conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy. Such participation by the Christian people as 'a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people' (1 Peter 2:9; see 2:4–5), is their right and duty by reason of their baptism" (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy [Sacrosanctum Concilium], 14). The hierarchy continues, but it is to hear and serve God's people; "servant leadership" is the way to exercise authority in the Church of Vatican II.

## **Feasts and Saints of the Week**

Our Lady of Fatima - Feast Day is May 13th. This feast is celebrated each year on this day and marks the first day in 1917 of our Lady's appearances to 3 shepherd children - Lucia dos Santos and her cousins, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, in Portugal. Over a series of 6 apparitions each month, they received prophetic messages of prayer, penance, and peace. She also revealed three secrets to them: visions of hell, the end of WWI and begining of WWII, and her request that Russia be consecrated to her Immaculate Heart. On the final apparition on

Oct. 13, 1917, a large crowd of residents gathered to witness the "Miracle of the Sun" in response to a prophecy. Three ways that we can honor her yearly are: consecrate ourselves to her, pray the rosary daily, and make the 5 First Saturdays devotions.

<u>St. Mathias</u> - Feast Day is May 14th. He was a 1<sup>st</sup> c. martyr chosen by God through the apostles to replace Judas Iscariot as the 12<sup>th</sup> apostle after the betrayal of Jesus. After Pentecost, when he received the Holy Spirit along with the other apostles, he went to preach the gospel in Judea and into the areas of Cappadocia (Turkey) and regions along the Caspian Sea, where he most likely was crucified and may have even been beheaded with a battle axe. His name is only mentioned in Acts 1 in 2 verses, but never after that in the New Testament. His name in Hebrew



means "Gift of God." He's the patron saint of carpenters, tailors, those with smallpox, and in prayers for perseverance and hope.



**St. Isidore** - Feast Day is May 15th. Known as Isidore the Laborer, he was also called Isidore the Farmer. He lived during the 11<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup> c. as a Spanish farmworker and is best known for his piety toward the poor and animals. In the mornings before going to work in the fields, he would usually attend mass at one of the churches in Madrid and be late for work. One day after complaints against him to the master, he was found in prayer while an angel was ploughing for him. Having the gift of miracles, he had roughly 438 miracles attributed to him. Often portrayed as a peasant with a sickle and a sheaf of corn, he prayed as he did his work of plowing, planting, and harvesting. His 3 great loves were God, his family, and the soil. He's the patron saint of farmers and rural communities.
